Angela Dewar Nesbit Exhibit at Tyler White Gallery

Charlotte artist and instructor Angela Dewar Nesbit returns to her hometown of Greensboro April 30 for an exhibition

at Tyler White Gallery, and to present a one-day workshop and "Lunch & Learn" demo at the gallery. Tyler White Gallery, 307 State Street, will host an Artist's Reception on April 30, 2011, from 6-8pm, which will also feature work from Elizabeth Darrow and Kim Kesterson Trone. The show will continue through May 19.

After 11 years studying oil painting since she broke away from her career in accounting to pursue parenthood and art, Angela Nesbit has developed a signature style that has attracted a following of collectors and students throughout the country to her endearing, action-packed portraits of children at play and lively still life paintings.

Accompanying Nesbit's exhibition in Greensboro, Tyler White will host a one-day workshop titled "Palette Knife and Still Life" on May 1. Nesbit teaches students her popular palette knife techniques at 3-4 workshops a year throughout the Southeast. John Redhead, a Greensboro businessman who has participated in two of Nesbit's workshops, appreciates her easy-going, supportive manner and her ability to effectively relay concepts and techniques to both the beginners and the experienced artists in the class. "I have worked with 3 experienced teachers during my 2 years painting, but have certainly learned the most from Angela Nesbit," he said.

Nesbit will also present a "Lunch & Learn" demo on April 30 at the gallery. Tyler White's popular "Lunch & Learn" series provides participants with an intimate opportunity to see the artist's techniques first hand and ask questions over lunch, included in the \$20 registration fee.

Nesbit is represented by seven galleries throughout the Southeast and one in California. She works from her sunny, loft-style studio in Charlotte's Historic South End district, producing paintings for shows and galleries, as well as non-traditional portraits of children and families for commission clients. "Painting is such a solitary activity, that it is a lot of fun to get to know a family and create a work of art that has great meaning to them," Nesbit says.
